Demand Notice-Against re-carpeting of road in Daddu Majra, without first scratching the earlier one.

Dear Sirs,

In this context, I may submit that I have read a report in "Punjab Kesri" of today (1.7.2019) that a road in Daddu Majra, Chandigarh is being re-carpeted without first scratching the earlier one, with the result that the level of the road has risen considerably above the level of the area. That being so, the surrounding area is likely to be flooded during coming Monsoon season.

You may kindly appreciate that the Municipal Corporation had taken a decision long back in the year 2011/2012 that before re-carpeting, the existing roads shall be scratched. The new system was implemented also during June, 2012 in Sector-22, Chandigarh market. The re-carpeting of road in Daddu Majra, in the manner, it is shown in the news report, is thus, against the Municipal Corporation's own decision on the issue, and is highly detrimental to the interest of residents of surrounding areas, as apart from being flooded, the sale value of those houses/markets is likely to fall, for which they can validly raise claims

against Municipal Corporation, Chandigarh, and Chandigarh administration for compensation.

In these circumstances, I would call upon you to immediate stop re-carpeting of road in Daddu Majra, and do its re-carpeting only after scratching of earlier one, so as to ensure that level of the road does not rise above the existing level. In case the needful is not done, and you continue with such illegal re-carpeting of the aforesaid road, in that event, I would file a PIL (Public Interest Litigation) against you for redressal of my aforesaid grievance, in public interest.
